You are a part of the Conservation team at the Teno Country Park


By adhering to the following suggestions during your visit, you can be an active participant in the conservation efforts in this area:

- Take all your litter, including organic waste with you when you leave. This will contribute to maintaining the beauty of the countryside and will prevent the increase of rodents in the area.
- Take special care when disposing of cigarette butts.
- Do not take plants, animals, or other objects from their natural environment. Doing so could result in the loss of irreplaceable resources.



Callejón de Teno A walk

in the country

Until a few decades ago this path was the only connecting road between El Palmar and Teno. Neighbours would use it to get to and from each other's

homes and farms in order to buy or exchange their products.

As you walk, you can imagine what living in those days was like, and discover that much of that rural way of life still continues to the present day.

There are various kinds of vegetation along the path uniquely adapted to their surroundings, from the rupicola on the steep, rugged slopes, to the thick and lush Monteverde forest following the gentle rise and fall of the hills and valleys of Meseta de Teno.

Finally you arrive at Los Bailaderos, a small village with a very traditional flavour both in its architecture and its local produce. Its cheeses, wines, honey and Saffron are worth special mention!

ROUTE DETAILS

Approximate duration: 3 h

Approximate altitude: 4.200 m

Characteristics: Very uneven path up to El Palmar, which can get quite slippery in some areas if wet. The rest of the route is very easygoing.

Difficulty: Medium

Climate: The air gets cooler and damper the higher up you are. Abrupt changes in temperature and weather are possible.

Recommended Materials: Strong and comfortable walking shoes, warm clothing, raincoat, sun hat and sun cream, water and something to eat. Walking sticks may be useful.

There is no regular public transport in Los Bailaders. It is recommended you return by taxi or leave a vehicle at the end of the route before beginning your walk.
