You are a part of the Conservation team at the Teno Country Park

By adhering to the following suggestions during your visit, you can be an active participant in the conservation efforts in this area:

- Stay on the designated paths and respect the privacy and way of life of the local inhabitants.
- Avoid making a lot of noise; you will discover much more of the life going on around you.
- Take all your litter, including organic waste with you when you leave. This will contribute to maintaining the beauty of the countryside and will prevent the increase of rodents in the area.
- Take special care when disposing of cigarette butts.
- Do not take plants, animals, or other objects from their natural environment. Doing so could result in the loss of irreplaceable resources.





This path runs between Erjos and Los Silos, along a well-conserved stretch of the century old Camino Real that links Puerto Santiago with Garachico.

You will enjoy the beauty and exuberance of the Monteverde vegetation, a forest that has been able to quickly recover the land that until only a few decades ago was cultivated.

The road leads you to the small village of Cuevas Negras (Black Caves), silent witness to the development of this small community of agricultural and cattle farmers.

Further down, the Montverde gives way to another kind of vegetation adapted to drier and sunnier conditions, although there are still a few small oases fed by the water from the cliffs.

The appearance of more tropical vegetation indicates that you are approaching the town of Los Silos, with its interesting display of traditional and religious architecture.
