
You are a part of the Conservation team at the Teno Country Park



Talavera

A journey millions of Along the path years in the making between Los Silos and El Palma, you

will discover a

spectacular landscape created by successive volcanic eruptions, the patient sculpturing of the wind and water and the contributions of both past and present inhabitants.

A winding rocky path rapidly ascends allowing you to contemplate the Isla Baja, the deep gorge of the Los Pasos Ravine and the remarkable formation of the Montaña Talavera and Roque Blanco.

The now abandoned houses and threshing floors of Talavera, speak of past survival in precarious times for agricultural and cattle farmers.

As you gain altitude, the simple coastal vegetation begins to be replaced by a more luscious variety right up to the Monteverde.

From the highest point of the path, you will be able to see the whole of the wide and fertile valley of El Palmar, where this route comes to an end.

ROUTE DETAILS

Approximate duration: 4 h

Approximate altitude: 6.7 km

Characteristics: Very uneven path for the first part of the walk. Some areas can become slippery when wet.

Dificulty: Medium

Climate: The higher up you go, the cooler and damper it becomes. Sudden changes in temperature and rainfall are possible.

Recommended Materials: Strong and comfortable walking shoes, warm clothing, raincoat, sun hat and sun cream, water and something to eat. Walking sticks may be useful.

There is regular public transport in Erjos and Los Silos. We recommend that you consult the timetables before beginning your walk.
